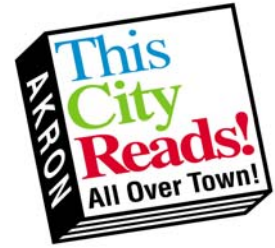

This alphabet book celebrates girls with names ranging from Aliko to Zoe and all the creative careers they can have when they grow up.

Corey, Shana. **You Forgot Your Skirt, Amelia Bloomer: A Very Improper Story.** Illustrated by Chelsley McLaren. JEasy

This brightly illustrated book tells the true story of Amelia Bloomer who popularized an alternative to the confining dresses of the 19th Century and started a newspaper for women.

All Ages:

San Souci, Robert . **Cut From the Same Cloth: American Women of Myth, Legend, and Tall Tale.** Illustrated by Brian Pinkney. J398.2108 Sa197c

This collection of twenty stories about legendary American women draws from folktales, popular stories and ballads and is illustrated with black and white scratchboard art.

Yolen, Jane. **Not One Damsel in Distress: World Folktales for Strong Girls.** Illustrated by Susan Guevara. J398.2208 Y54n

This is a collection of thirteen traditional tales from various parts of the world, each of whose main characters is a fearless, strong, heroic, and resourceful woman.
